


United Way of Mesa County

Community Impact Fund

The United Way of Mesa County Community Impact Fund is a competitive two-year grant awarded to Mesa County nonprofits that provide services related to health, education, and self-reliance. Funds are raised by United Way staff and volunteers through workplace giving campaigns, individual donor cultivation, special events, grants, foundations, and from nation-wide fundraising efforts overseen by United Way Worldwide.

After our annual fundraising campaign, we begin our Community Investment Process, or "Deciding Where the Money Goes"-- we feel the people who donate the money should be involved in giving it away! Between 60-80 volunteers, people like you, serve on our community allocation panels each grant cycle. These panels review grant applications from agencies and make on-site visits to help determine which programs are most effective and efficient at delivering the services our community needs.

Donor Designated Funds

United Way also manages donor-designated funds. While undesignated donations go toward the Community Impact Fund, nearly a quarter of donations to United Way of Mesa County are donor designated to specific agencies or programs.

Community Grant Management

United Way of Mesa County helps administer multiple federal and local grants, including the Emergency Food and Shelter Program grant funded by FEMA, which allocated close to \$300,000 to Mesa County emergency food and housing organizations in 2022.











The Mesa County Imagination Library, run by United Way of Mesa County in partnership with the Dollywood Foundation, is a powerful early childhood literacy program that mails free, high-quality books to children from birth to age five, no matter their family's income. Books are mailed monthly to every registered child across Mesa County, and the selection is determined by an expert panel in early childhood literacy for content that is informative, age-appropriate, and inspiring.





UNITED FOR **** CHILD CARE

Mesa County has been described as a "childcare desert" due to a lack of affordable childcare options. The United Way of Mesa County Childcare Fund works closely with local childcare facilities, government officials, and experts on childcare to find solutions. The economic, social, and educational issues tied to childcare are complex and it is easy to feel helpless. By donating to this fund, not only may your gift be eligible for Colorado tax incentives, it also guarantees that your contribution is doing the most good by addressing current pressing needs.







Volunteer United is an innovative online community volunteer portal hosted and managed by United Way of Mesa County that features up-to-date volunteer opportunities from dozens of nonprofits across Mesa County. The portal is hosted right on the United Way of Mesa County website, providing those looking to give back a simple and accessible one-stop shop for meaningful volunteer positions in their local area.





United Way of Mesa County is teaming up with local agencies to offer community-based education courses and outreach programs to help raise awareness, inspire solutions, and help solve the issue of homelessness in our community. The courses will be designed to help those currently experiencing homelessness and connecting that population to resources to help secure permanent housing and basic needs, to help current homeowners who could quickly lose their homes understand options available to them, and to teach the general public, business community, local government and nonprofts the impacts of homelessness in our community and how to advocate for change.
